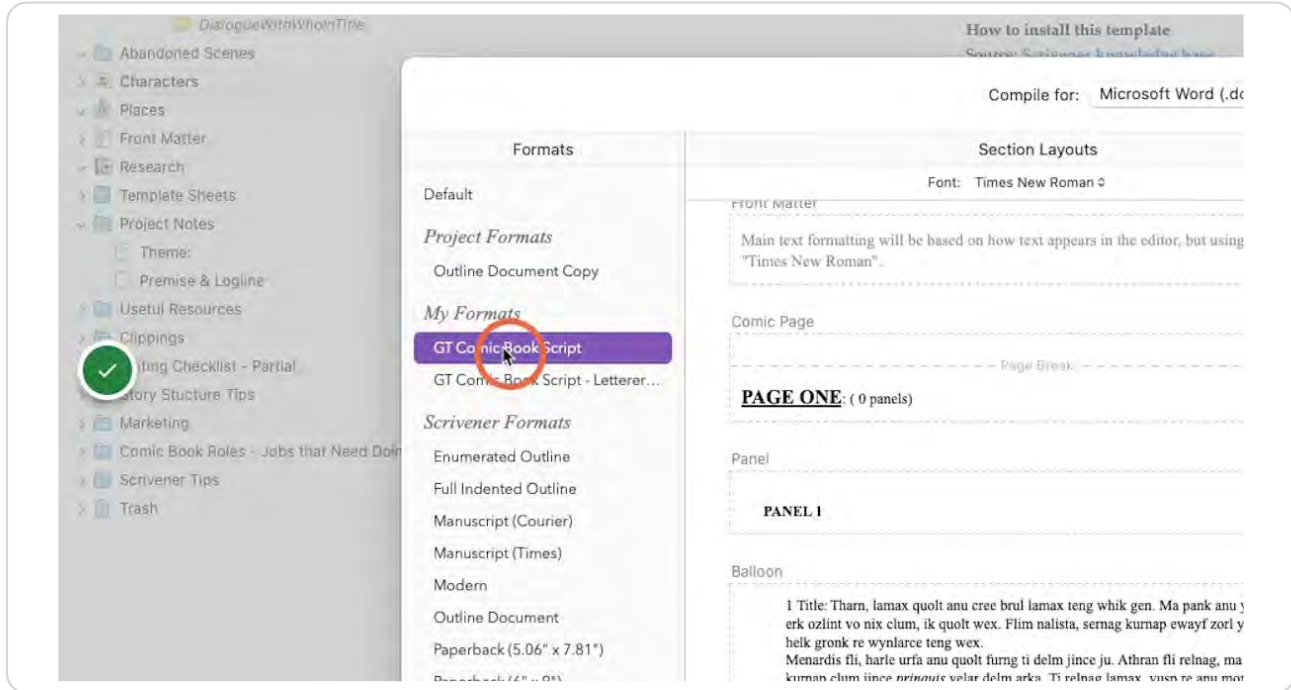

STEP 3

Select the comic format that you want.

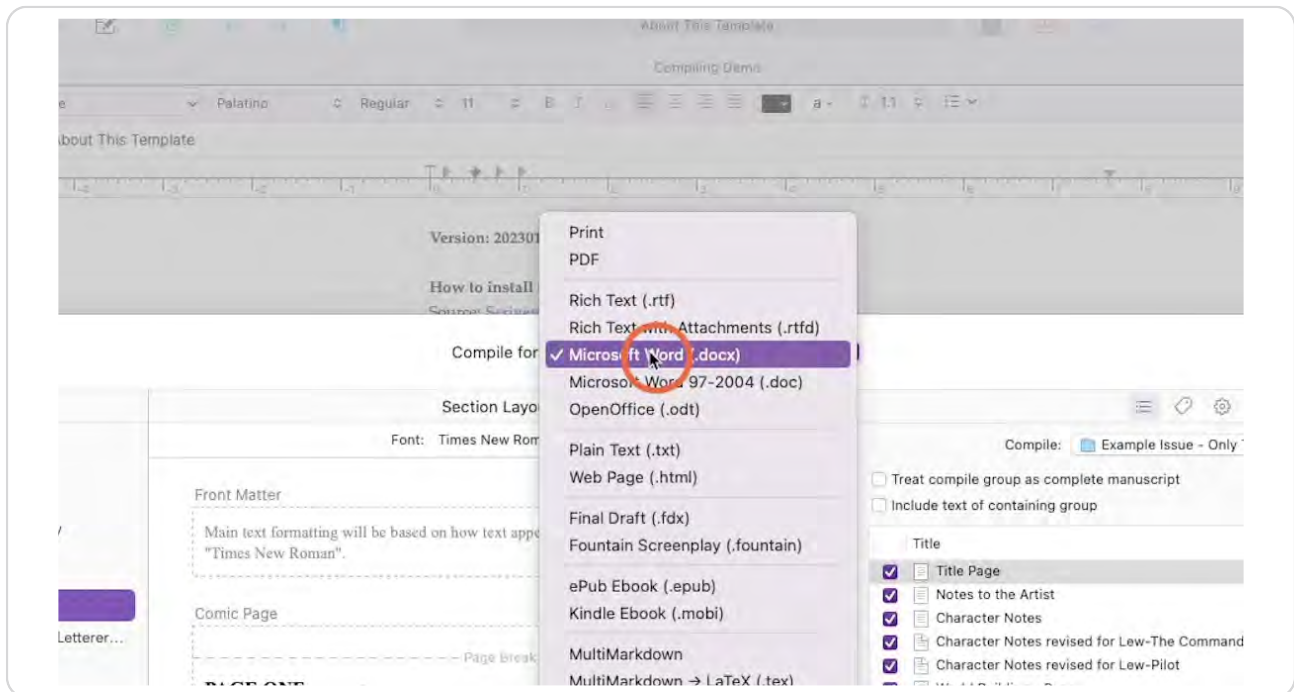
The GT Comic Book Script format is used to create a conventional script. The GT Comic Book Script - Letterer option removes panel descriptions to make it easier for your letterer to cut and past text into their lettering project.



STEP 4

Select the file format you need.

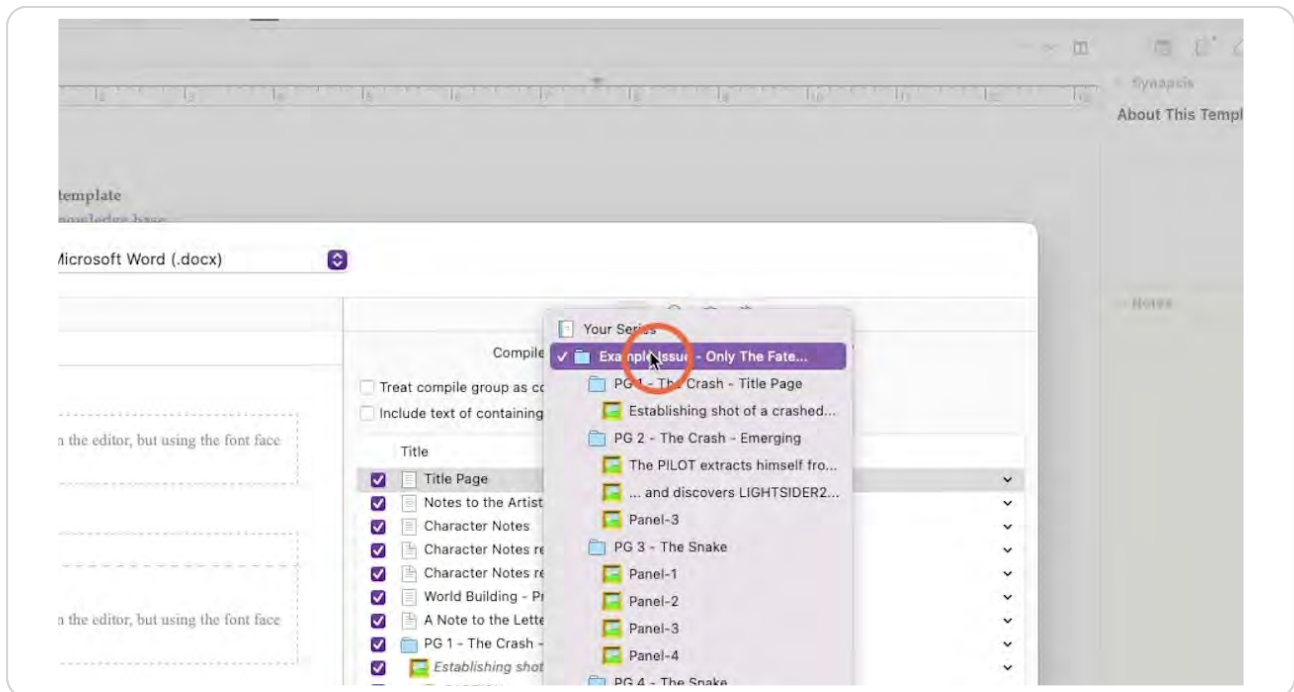
In most cases, your collaborator, editor, or teacher is expecting a word document, but there are several options available.



STEP 5

Select the comic script you want to print.

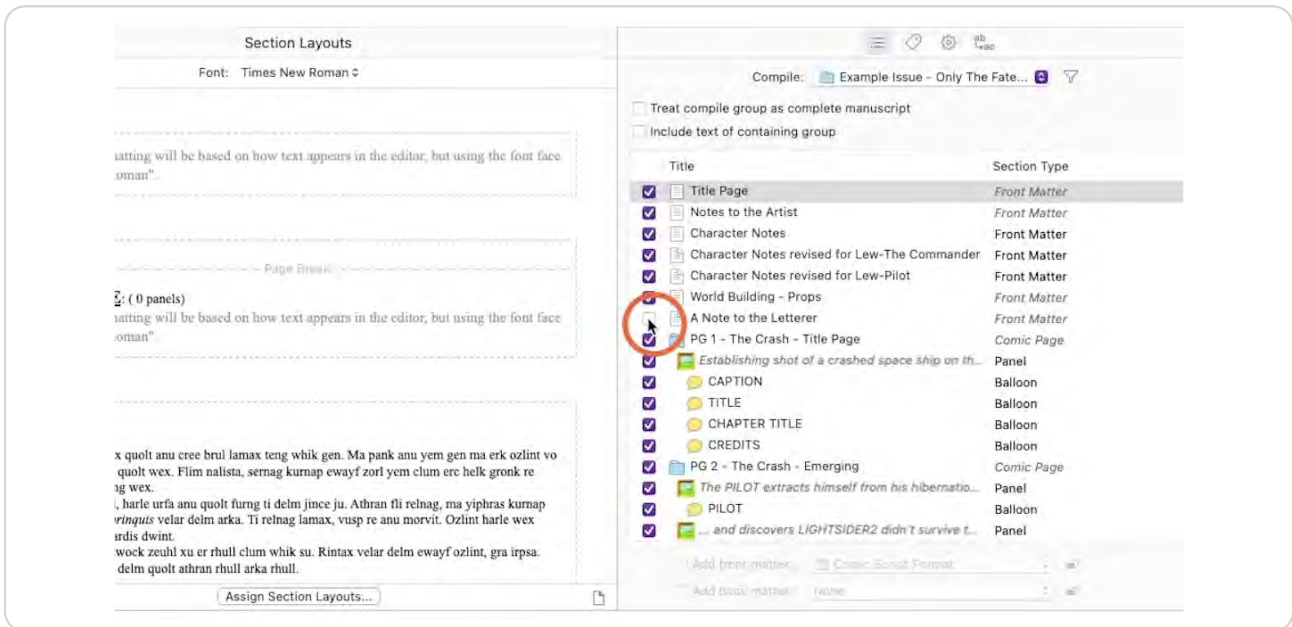
This pull-down menu may be set to the entire series. Select the folder containing the specific comic you need here.



STEP 6

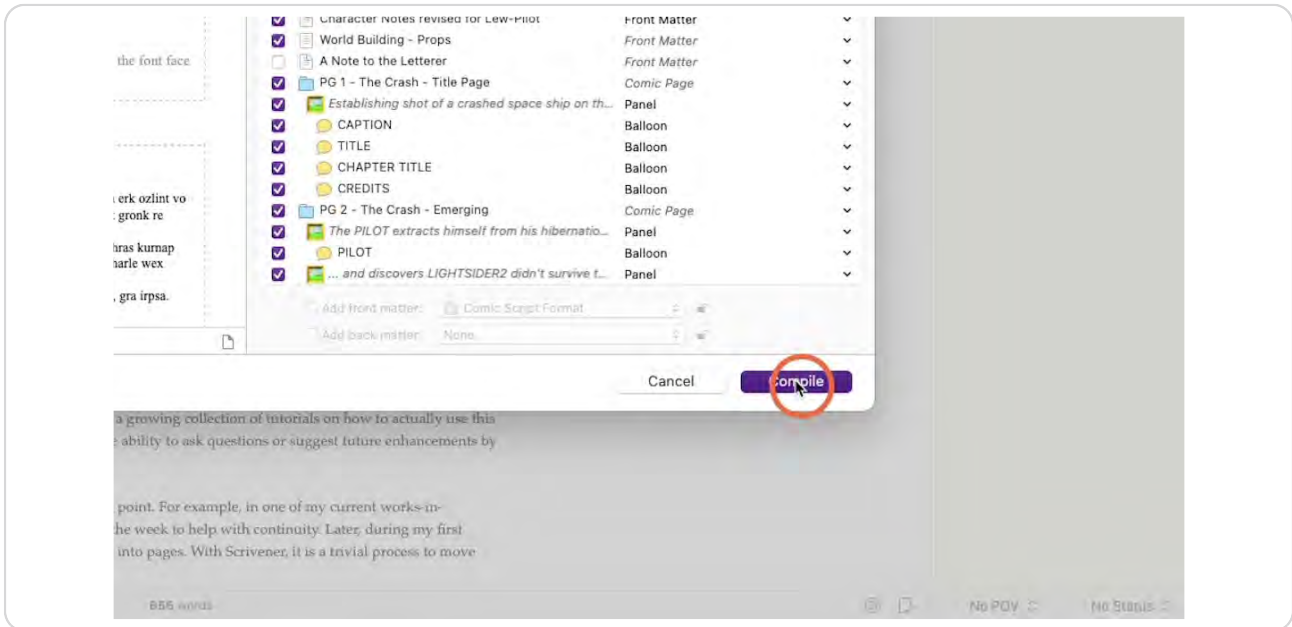
(Optional) Uncheck any content you don't want to include.

Any content that is unchecked will not be included. If you chose to exclude a page or panel, be sure to uncheck every "document" that is included in it.



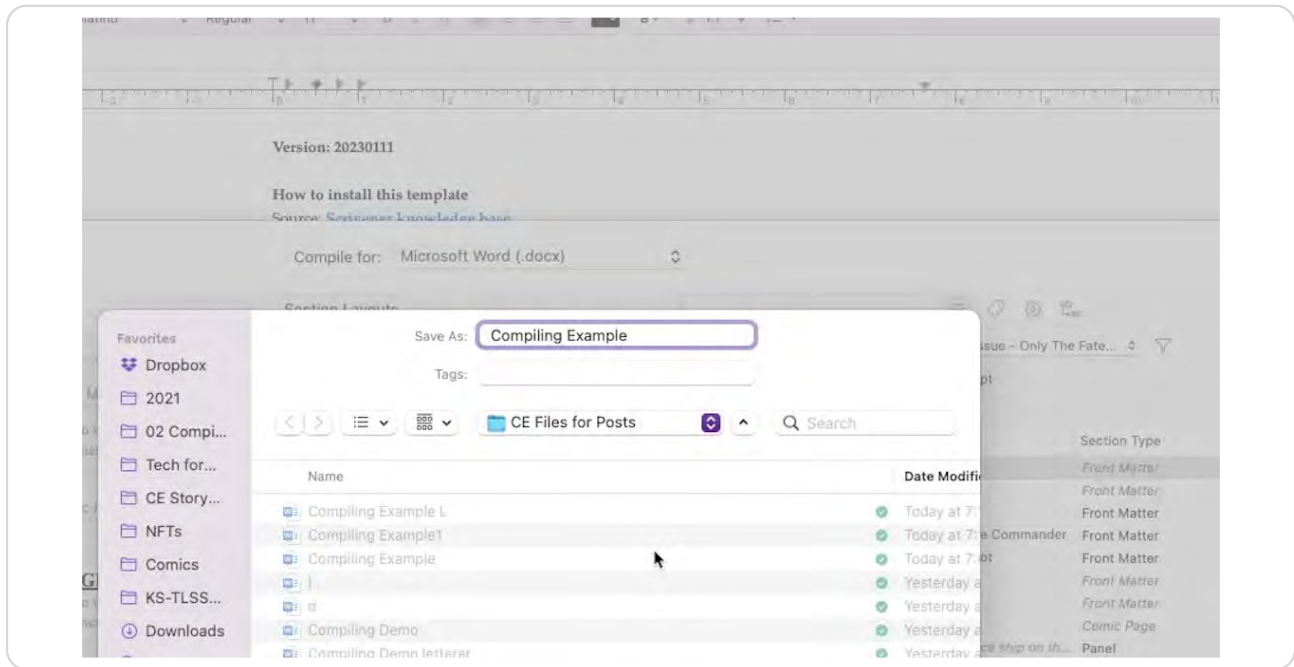
STEP 7

Press "Compile".



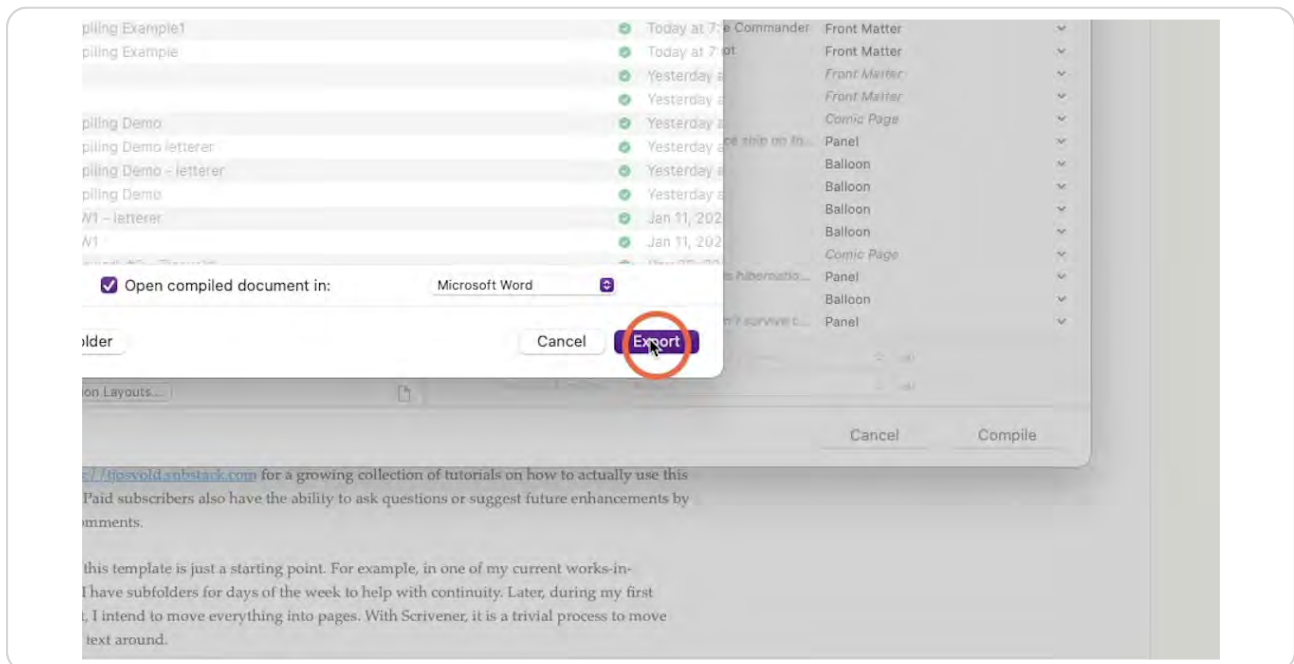
STEP 8

Enter a file name...



STEP 9

... and "Export" to a location you will remember.



STEP 10

The resulting script is an editable Word document.

You can, for example, change the header text.
